I. Technology & References

WS1 meeting

After a long period without face-to-face WS1 meetings, the group has met on June 18th and 19th in Saclay, France. The technical working group had a very good and productive session and following latest SSC's decisions, the group further developed the WS1 roadmap by declining it in technical working items:

- 4 CCTTs have been processed of which 2 have been approved.
- The "User Guidelines" roadmap item was declined into 11 technical work items. Candidate adopters of the G3-PLC technology often come to biased conclusions related to the suitability of the G3-PLC technology due to the lack of expertise in implementing and deploying the G3-PLC protocol stack. The Alliance decided to publish technical information to allow for seamless new deployments. The first tasks of WS1 on this matter is to consolidate return on experience from various deployments according to G3-PLC Alliance member feedback. Then, the information gathered with associated solutions will be disseminated in an appropriate format (white paper, FAQ, etc.).
- Remarks regarding the performance of coherent system have been discussed and this may need to be tested more extensively in the certification. This will be further discussed in WS3 and CPEC.
- Possibilities of a hybrid communication profile based on the IEEE 802.15.4g specification are being explored.
- "Increase performances in dense networks" roadmap item was declined into 9 technical work items. WS1 will work on this matter using the ETT/CCTT process to quickly further improve G3-PLC in existing and future deployments.
- The G3-PLC technology is expanding to worldwide markets especially in Asia, Middle-East and Africa. Some new requirements and specificities have been identified and shall be taken into account by WS1 to update the G3-PLC protocol stack or to be simply mentioned in user guidelines. Several work items have been identified and will be elaborated by WS1.

Input to ITU SG15 meeting may be proposed in the September/October timeframe in order to prepare a new amendment or revision of the ITU-T G.9903 recommendation. This is still to be decided depending on the outcome of the upcoming WS1 meetings.

As reported in the previous Infoletter, the G3-PLC Alliance entered into a cooperation with professor A. Tonello, chair of Embedded Communication Systems at the University of Klagenfurt. Updates about the collaboration with Klagenfurt University aiming at the exploration of how Machine Learning can benefit to G3-PLC were discussed.

At African Utility Week in Cape Town from 14th to 16th May, G3-PLC Alliance presented African African itself with a booth at the exhibition. The 18 m² booth featured a showcase of G3-PLC Utility Week Week a lot of members and the G3-PLC demonstration suitcase. Fortunately, a lot of members were also on site at the exhibition, with several representatives present at the G3-PLC Alliance booth. G3-PLC is well known in Africa, has good reputation and in many countries DSO's are considering or piloting G3-PLC.

AMI training program at Indian Smart Grid Forum

As you will know, India is considering a plan to install smart meters in every home and business as part of its ongoing effort to turn around the country's ailing power sector. The plan under consideration would require several hundreds of million smart meters over three years.

In July the Indian Smart Grid Forum organized a training program on advanced metering infrastructure in Delhi for utility professionals. To promote G3-PLC the G3-PLC Alliance facilitated part of the training. India offers a big opportunity for smart metering and we have again drawn attention to G3-PLC.

Some general requirements regarding Indian smart meters:

- All meters must be IPv6.
- India uses DLMS/COSEM that has been translated into a national Indian standard (IS 15959).

• Interoperability as well as firmware update are key requirements.
